CAMP Science Program: NSF/UC program provides support for ethnically underrepresented students majoring in the sciences, mathematics, engineering, and technology. Students must be African American, Mexican American, Latino/Hispanic, American Indian, Alaskan Native, or Native Pacific Islander and also be permanent residents or U.S. Citizens.



Conference for Research in the Arts, Social Sciences, & Humanities (CRASSH): The purpose of this conference is to recognize the research done at UCSD in the Arts, Social Sciences, and Humanities as well as to encourage undergraduates to pursue research in these fields. Open to all students.

Faculty Mentor Program



Faculty Mentor Program: student work on independent study projects for 2 quarters and present their research at the end of the year. Open to all UCSD students with at least 90 units and a GPA \geq 2.7.



Health and Medical Professions Preparation Program (HMP3): assists students interested in careers in the health professions. Open to all UCSD students.



McNair Scholars Program: federal grant program serves low-income, first generation or underrepresented college students interested in pursuing PhD's. Students must be interested in receiving a PhD, have at least a 3.0 GPA, and have at least Junior standing.



Maximizing Access to Research Careers (MARC): NIH-funded 2 year program provides mentored research experience, monthly stipend and other support for underrepresented students interested in pursuing PhD's in the biosciences. Students must maintain at least a 3.5 GPA.



Medical Education for Diverse Student (MEDS): The MEDS conference's goal is to encourage, educate, and empower students on their road to a career in health.



National Action Council for Minorities in Engineering (NACME): provides scholarships to minority students pursuing a degree in engineering. Open to underrepresented students in engineering. Students must maintain a GPA of at least 2.9.



National Competitive Scholarships: helps UCSD undergraduates to win national scholarships, including the Rhodes, Strauss, and Fulbright, among others. For UCSD undergraduates or graduating seniors.



Summer Research Program: 8 week summer program provides 30 hours a week of mentored research experience in addition to housing, GRE training, and a stipend. Open to UCSD student with a GPA of 3.0 or above.



Undergraduate Research Conference: gives undergraduates the opportunity to present their research. The event is held at the end of April each year at the UCSD Faculty Club. Students must be nominated by their professor. Open to all enrolled UCSD students.



UCSD Undergraduate Research Scholarships: 8 scholarships with award amounts of \$4000 for UCSD undergraduates conducting research over the summer. Requirements differ depending on scholarship.
